- Expanding the Business Integrity Forum (BIF) to include also more small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).
- Informing and promoting compliance with anti-corruption and anti-money laundering regulations.
- Building bridges with the public sector to promote efficient and appropriate legislation.

Public Sector:

- Monitoring Belgium's adherence to international anti-corruption commitments (UNCAC, OECD, EU, GRECO...).
- Providing datasets and data visualizations on lobbying, procurement, and political finance.
- Advocacy for better rules, regulation and enforcement.

Wide Society

- Raising awareness through communication campaigns, media engagement, and educational initiatives.
- Launching the "Integrity Official of the Year" award to recognize leaders in ethics and accountability.
